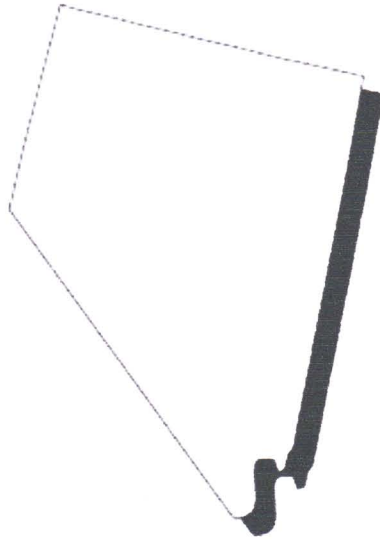

FEDERAL LAWS

In addition to the ARPA Laws, an additional Federal law called "Abandoned Shipwreck Act of 1987" is in effect and is being enforced.

This law gives the individual States control over historic shipwrecks lying within 3 miles of the Atlantic and Pacific coasts and 10 miles off of the Gulf Coast.

DISTANCE MEASUREMENTS NOTE:

All distance measurements for sites are direct, from point A to point B and are **NOT** road measurements. Distance measurements are taken from the center of one point to the center of the other. Linear measurements are usually accurate to one tenth mile (1/10th mile), while Latitude and Longitude coordinates are accurate to one thousandth of one second, which equates to approximately 30 feet.

WHAT IS A GHOST TOWN?

There have been many inquiries as to how we have determined what establishes the parameters for ghost town status. While there doesn't seem to be any defined parameters, Mosquito Publishing has used the following:

That a town or settlement was at one time a thriving and viable community.
That it subsequently declined to the point that it was virtually abandoned or deserted.

It was a rule of thumb that communities were established on good land. That being the case, even though the original town may have declined to ghost town status, as modern communities expand, they often cover the site of a previous settlement. This occurrence is happening more rapidly as our population expands. The site would still be considered as a ghost town site, even if covered by modern construction and no visible signs of the original town exists.

206.320 Unlawful removal of petrified wood from posted or designated sites: duties of certain officers.

1. The board of museums and history may, by itself or by its designated representative, post or otherwise properly designate a site containing petrified wood deemed of sufficient importance to preserve in its natural state.
2. It is unlawful to disturb or remove any petrified wood from a designated site.
3. Any violation of this section is a misdemeanor.
4. The division of state parks of the state department of conservation and natural resources, and personnel thereof, the sheriffs, in their respective counties, and all other peace officers shall enforce this section.

1. "Historic" means after the middle of the 18th century.
2. "Historic site" means a site, landmark or monument of historical significance pertaining to the white man's history of Nevada, or Indian campgrounds, shelters, petroglyphs. Pictographs and burials.
3. "Prehistoric" means before the middle of the 18th century.
4. "Prehistoric site" means any archaeological or paleontological site, ruin, deposit, fossilized footprints and other impressions, petroglyphs and pictographs, habitation caves, rock shelters, natural caves or burial ground.

381.197 Permit required to investigate, explore or excavate historic or prehistoric site. No person shall investigate, explore or excavate an historic or prehistoric site on federal or state lands or remove any object therefrom unless he is the holder of a valid and current permit issued pursuant to the provisions of NRS 381.195 to 381.227, inclusive.

-ANNOTATIONS-

Attorney General's Opinions.

Ichthyosaur Park Act governs where in conflict with section. If conflict arises between statute providing for exploration and excavation permits, NRS 381.200 et seq. (cf. NRS 381.197 et seq.), and Ichthyosaur Park Act (NRS 407.160 et seq.), latter will control as it is special act. AGO 389

State permit expires upon expiration or revocation of federal permit. If federal permit to explore and excavate on federal lands is revoked or expires, state permit issued pursuant To federal permit also expires. AGO 389

381.199 Applicant for permit required to secure state and federal permits.

1. An applicant is required to secure, from the director, or an agent designated by the director, a permit for the investigation, exploration or excavation of any state or federal lands within the boundaries of the State of Nevada.

2. If the land to be investigated, explored or excavated is owned or held by the United States, the applicant is also required to secure a permit from the proper authorities in accordance with the provisions of 16 U.S.C. 431 to 433, inclusive.

381.201 Director may designate agents to issue permits: agents may adopt regulations. The director may designate any state board, state department, division of a state department or state institution as an agent for the purpose of issuing permits. The agency so designated may adopt regulations relating to investigations, explorations or excavations carried out pursuant to any permit issued by that agency.

381.203 Qualifications of applicant for permit; contents of application; regulations.

1. In order to qualify as the recipient of a permit, the applicant must show:

(a) That the investigation, exploration or excavation is undertaken for the benefit of a reputable museum, university, college or other recognized scientific or educational institution, with a view of increasing knowledge.

(b) That the gathering is made for permanent preservation in public museums or other recognized educational or scientific institutions.

(c) That the applicant possesses sufficient knowledge and scientific training to make such an investigation, exploration or excavation.

(d) The location of the site where the applicant proposes to investigate, explore or excavate.

2. The director may prescribe reasonable regulations for carrying out such investigations, explorations or excavations.

381.205 Notice to certain officers when permit granted.

Upon granting the permit, the director shall immediately notify the division of historic preservation and archaeology of the state department of conservation and natural resources, the sheriff in the county in which the permit is to be exercised, and personnel of the Nevada highway patrol controlling the state roads of the district embracing the site in which the permit is to be exercised.

381.207 Percentage of articles, implements and materials found or discovered by certain holders of permits to be given to state institutions and political subdivisions.

(1) The holder of a permit, except as provided in subsections 2 and 3, who does work upon aboriginal mounds and earthworks, ancient burial grounds, prehistoric sites, deposits of fossil bones or other archaeological and vertebrate paleontological features within the state shall give to the state 50 percent of all articles, implements and materials found or discovered, to be deposited with the state museum, for exhibition or other use within the state as determined by the director. The director may, in his discretion, accept less than 50 percent of such items. Upon receipt of items pursuant to this subsection the director shall notify the division of historic preservation and archaeology of the state department of conservation and natural resources.

(2) The holder of a permit who does any such work within the state under the authority and direction of the Nevada historical society, the Nevada museum and historical society, or an institution or political subdivision of the state shall give 50 percent of all articles, implements and materials found or discovered to the society, institution or political subdivision. The holder of the permit may retain the other 50 percent.

(3) If the Nevada historical society, the Nevada museum and historical society, or an institution or political subdivision of the state is the holder of the permit, it may retain all articles, implements and materials found or discovered.

(4) Whenever the division of historic preservation and archaeology acquires articles, implements and materials under the provisions of this section, they must be transferred to the director for exhibition or other use within the state as determined by the director.

381.209 Permit: Limitations and conditions.

The director may limit a permit as to time and location. A permit shall not be granted:

- 1 For a period of more than 1 year.
- 2 For investigation, exploration or excavation in a larger area than the applicant can reasonably be expected to explore fully and systematically within the time limit set in the permit.
- 3 For the removal of any ancient monument, structure or site which can be permanently preserved under the control of the State of Nevada in situ, and remain an object of interest, if desired by the state, for a park, landmark or monument, for the benefit of the public.

381.211 Permit: Renewal.

A permit may be renewed for an additional period of time upon application by the permit holder, if the work contemplated by the permit has been diligently prosecuted.

381.213 Permit: Conditions for voiding.

Failure to begin work under the permit within 6 months after the effective date of the permit, or failure to prosecute diligently such work after it is began, shall render the permit void without any order from the board.

381.215 Report of holder of permit to director.

After the close of each season's work, within a reasonable time designated in the permit, every permit holder shall furnish to the director a report containing a detailed account of the work done, material collected and other pertinent data.

381.217 Collections of petrified wood authorized; limitations.

A permit holder may collect specimens of petrified wood, subject to limitations of NRS 206.320

381.219 Collection of certain minerals and artifacts and photography not prohibited.

Nothing contained in NRS 381.195 to 381.227, inclusive, shall interfere with or prevent any person from collecting minerals, rocks or gems, arrowheads or other Indian artifacts so long as they are not part of a prehistoric site, nor prevent the photographing of objects of interest.

381.221 Enforcement by division of state parks, sheriffs and other peace officers.

The division of state parks of the state department of conservation and natural resources, and personnel thereof, the sheriffs in their respective counties, the Nevada highway patrol, and all other peace officers shall be charged with enforcement of NRS 381.195 to 381.227, inclusive. Those persons charged with the enforcement of NRS 381.195 to 381.227, inclusive may at any time, examine the permit of any person claiming privileges granted under NRS 381.195 to 381.227, inclusive, and may fully examine all work done under the permit.

381.223 Seizure and forfeiture of object of antiquity taken without permit.

Any object taken or collection made, on historic or prehistoric sites covered by NRS 381.195 to 381.227 inclusive, without a permit shall be seized by the proper law enforcement officers, who shall notify the director of the action. The object or collection so taken shall be forfeited to the state at the Nevada state museum for exhibition or other use within the state as determined by the director. Upon receipt of any forfeited item pursuant to this section the director shall notify the division of historic preservation and archaeology of the state department of conservation and natural resources.

381.225 Acts of vandalism unlawful; penalty.

1. It is unlawful for any person to commit vandalism upon any historic or prehistoric sites, natural monuments, speleological sites and object of antiquity, or to write or paint or carve initials or words, or in any other way deface, any of those objects, Indian paintings or historic buildings.

2. Unless a greater penalty is provided in NRS 206.125, a person violating the provisions of subsection 1 is guilty of a public offense proportionate to the value of the property damaged or destroyed as set forth in NRS 193.155.

381.227 Penalty.

Except as otherwise provided in NRS 381.225, any person violating any of the provisions of NRS 381.195 to 381.227, inclusive, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

PROTECTION OF INDIAN BURIAL SITES

383.150 Definitions.

As used in NRS 383.150 to 383.190, inclusive, unless the context otherwise requires:

1. "Cairn" means stones or other material placed in a pile as a memorial monument to the dead.
2. "Grave" means an excavation for burial of a human body.
3. "Indian burial site" means the area including and immediately surrounding the cairn or grave of a native Indian.
4. "Indian tribe" means a Nevada Indian tribe recognized by the Secretary of the Interior.
5. "Professional archaeologist" means a person who holds a graduate degree in archaeology, anthropology or a closely related field as determined by the director of the division.

383.160 Duties of division.

The division shall:

1. Upon application by:
 - (a) An interested landowner, assist the landowner in negotiating an agreement with an Indian tribe for the treatment and disposition of an Indian burial site and any artifacts and human remains associated with the site; and
 - (b) Either party, mediate a dispute arising between a landowner and an Indian tribe relating to the treatment and disposition of an Indian burial site and any artifacts and human remains associated with the site.
2. In performing its duties pursuant to NRS 383.150 to 383.190, inclusive, endeavor to:
 - (a) Protect Indian burial sites and any associated artifacts and human remains from vandalism and destruction; and
 - (b) Provide for the sensitive treatment and disposition of Indian burial sites and any associated artifacts and human remains consistent with the planned use of the land.

383.170 Procedure upon discovery of Indian burial site; permissible excavation.

1. A person who disturbs the cairn or grave of a native Indian through inadvertence while engaged in a lawful activity such as construction, mining, logging or farming and any other person who discovers the cairn or grave of a native Indian shall immediately report the discovery and the location of the Indian

burial site to the division. The division shall immediately consult with the Nevada Indian commission and notify the appropriate Indian tribe. The Indian tribe may, with the permission of the landowner, inspect the site and recommend an appropriate means for the treatment and disposition of the site and all artifacts and human remains associated with the site.

2. If the Indian burial site is located on private land and:

(a) The Indian tribe fails to make a recommendation within 48 hours after it receives notification pursuant to subsection 1; or

(b) The landowner rejects the recommendation and mediation conducted pursuant to NRS 383.160 fails to provide measures acceptable to the landowner. The landowner shall, at his own expense, reinter with appropriate dignity all artifacts and human remains associated with the site in a location not subject to further disturbance.

3. If the Indian burial site is located on public land and action is necessary to protect the burial site from immediate destruction, the division, may cause a professional archaeologist to excavate the site and remove all artifacts and human remains associated with the site for subsequent reinterment, following scientific study, under the supervision of the Indian tribe.

4. Any other excavation of an Indian burial site may be conducted only:

(a) By a professional archaeologist;

(b) After written notification to the administrator; and

(c) With the prior written consent of the appropriate Indian tribe.

Failure of a tribe to respond to a request for permission within 60 days after its mailing by certified mail, return receipt requested, shall be deemed consent to the excavation..

All artifacts and human remains removed during such an excavation must, following scientific study, be reinterred under the supervision of the Indian tribe, except that the Indian tribe may, by explicit written consent, authorize the public display of a particular artifact. The archaeologist, Indian tribe and landowner shall negotiate an agreement to determine who will pay the expenses related to the interment.

383.180 Prohibited acts; penalties; exceptions.

1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 383.170, a person who willfully removes, mutilates, defaces, injures or destroys the cairn or grave of a native Indian is guilty of a misdemeanor.

2. A person who:

(a) Possesses an artifact or human remains taken from the cairn or grave of a native Indian on or after October 1, 1989, in a manner other than that authorized by NRS 383.170;

(b) Publicly displays or exhibits any of the human remains of a native Indian, except during a funeral ceremony; or

(c) Sell any artifact or human remains taken from the cairn or grave of a native Indian, is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

3. This section does not apply to:

- (a) the possession or sale of an artifact:
 - (1) Discovered in or taken from a location other than the cairn or grave of a native Indian; or
 - (2) Removed from the cairn or grave of a native Indian by other than human action; or
- (b) Action taken by a peace officer in the performance of his duties.

383.190 Civil remedy.

1. In addition to the imposition of any criminal penalty, an Indian tribe or an enrolled member of an Indian tribe may bring a civil action to secure an injunction, damages and other appropriate relief against a person who violates NRS 383.171 or 383.180. The action must be brought within 2 years after the discovery of the action by the plaintiff. The action may be filed in the district court for the county in which the cairn, grave, artifacts or remains are located, or within which the defendant resides.

2. If the plaintiff prevails in the action:

(a) The court may award reasonable attorney fees to the plaintiff.

(b) The court may grant injunctive or such other equitable relief as is appropriate, including forfeiture of any artifacts or human remains acquitted or equipment used in the violation. The court shall order the disposition of any forfeited equipment as it sees fit, and order the reinterment of the artifacts and human remains at the defendant's expense under the supervision of the Indian tribe.

(c) The plaintiff may recover actual damages.

3. If the defendant prevails in the action, the court may award reasonable attorney fees to the defendant.

Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979

AN ACT To protect archaeological resources on public lands and Indian lands, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted of the Senate and the house of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SHORT TITLE

Section 1. This Act may be cited as the "Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979".

FINDINGS AND PURPOSE

SEC. 2. (a) The Congress finds that-

- (1) archaeological resources on public lands and Indian lands are an accessible and irreplaceable part of the Nation's heritage;
- (2) these resources are increasingly endangered because of their commercial attractiveness;
- (3) existing Federal laws do not provide adequate protection to prevent the loss and destruction of these archaeological resources and sites resulting from uncontrolled excavations and pillage; and
- (4) there is a wealth of archaeological information which has been legally obtained by private individuals for noncommercial purposes and which could voluntarily be made available to professional archaeologists and institutions.

(b) The purpose of this Act is to secure, for the present and future benefit of the American people, the protection of archaeological resources and sites which are on public lands and Indian lands, and to foster increased cooperation and exchange of information between governmental authorities, the professional archaeological community, and private individuals having collections of archaeological resources and data which were obtained before the date of the enactment of this Act.

DEFINITIONS

SEC. 3. As used in this Act-

- (1) The term "archaeological resource" means any material remains of past human life or activities which are of archaeological interest, as determined under the uniform regulations promulgated pursuant to this Act.
Such regulations containing such determination shall include, but not be limited to: pottery, basketry, bottles, weapons, weapon projectiles, tools, structures or portions of structures, pit houses, rock paintings, rock carvings, intaglios, graves, human skeletal materials, or any portion or piece of any of the foregoing items.
Non-fossilized and fossilized paleontological specimens, or any portion or piece thereof, shall not be considered archaeological resources, under the regulations under this paragraph, unless found in an archaeological context. No item shall be treated as an archaeological resource under regulations under this paragraph unless such item is at least 100 years of age.
- (2) The term "Federal land manager" means, with respect to any public lands, the Secretary of the department, or the head of any other agency or instrumentality of the United States, having primary management authority over such lands. In the case of any public lands or Indian lands with respect to which no department, agency, or instrumentality has primary management authority, such term means the Secretary of the Interior. If the Secretary of the Interior consents, the responsibilities (in whole or in part) under this Act of the Secretary of any department (other than the Department of the Interior) or the head of any other agency or instrumentality may be delegated to the Secretary of the Interior with respect to any land managed by such other Secretary or agency head, and in any such case, the term "Federal land manager" means the Secretary of the Interior.
- (3) The term "public lands" means-
 - (A) lands which are owned and administered by the United States as part of -
 - (i) the national park system,
 - (ii) the national wildlife refuge system, or
 - (iii) the national forest system; and
 - (B) all other lands the fee title to which is held by the United States, other than lands on the Outer Continental Shelf and lands which are under the jurisdiction of the Smithsonian Institution;
- (4) The term "Indian lands" means lands of Indian tribes, or Indian individuals, which are either held in trust by the United States or subject to a restriction against alienation imposed by the United States, except for any subsurface interest in lands not owned or controlled by an Indian tribe or an Indian individual.
- (5) The term "Indian tribe" means any Indian tribe, band, nation, or other organized group or community, including any Alaska Native village or regional or village corporation as defined in, or established pursuant to, the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (85 Stat. 688).

- (6) The term "person" means an individual, corporation, partnership, trust, institution, association, or any other private entity or any officer, employee, agent, department, or instrumentality of the United States, of any Indian tribe, or of any State or political subdivision thereof.
- (7) The term "State" means any of the fifty States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Virgin Islands.

EXCAVATION AND REMOVAL

- SEC. 4. (a) Any person may apply to the Federal land manager for a permit to excavate or remove any archaeological resource located on public lands or Indian lands and to carry out activities associated with such excavation or removal. The application shall be required, under uniform regulations under this Act, to contain such information as the Federal land manager deems necessary, including information concerning the time, scope, and location and specific purpose of the proposed work.
- (b) A permit may be issued pursuant to an application under subsection (a) if the Federal land manager determines, pursuant to uniform regulations under this Act, that-
 - (1) the applicant is qualified, to carry out the permitted activity,
 - (2) the activity is undertaken for the purpose of furthering archaeological knowledge in the public interest,
 - (3) the archaeological resources which are excavated or removed from public lands will remain the property of the United States, and such resources and copies of associated archaeological records and data will be preserved by a suitable university, museum, or other scientific or educational institution, and
 - (4) the activity pursuant to such permit is not inconsistent with any management plan applicable to the public lands concerned.
 - (c) If a permit issued under this section may result in harm to, or destruction of, any religious or cultural site, as determined by the Federal land manager, before issuing such permit, the Federal land manager shall notify any Indian tribe which may consider the site as having religious or cultural importance. Such notice shall not be deemed a disclosure to the public for purposes of section 9.
 - (d) Any permit under this section shall contain terms and conditions, pursuant to uniform regulations promulgated under this Act, as the Federal land manager concerned deems necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act.
 - (e) Each permit under this section shall identify the individual who shall be responsible for carrying out the terms and conditions of the permit and for otherwise complying with this Act and other law applicable to the permitted activity.
 - (f) Any permit issued under this section may be suspended by the Federal land manager upon his determination that the permittee has violated any provision of subsection (a), (b), or (c) of section 6. Any such permit may be revoked by such Federal land manager upon assessment of a civil penalty under section 7 against the permittee or upon the permittee's conviction under section 6.
 - (g)
 - (1) No permit shall be required under this section or under the Act of June 8, 1906 (16 U.S.C. 431), for the excavation or removal by any Indian tribe or member thereof of any archaeological resource located on Indian lands of such Indian tribe, except that in the absence of tribal law regulating the excavation or removal of archaeological resources on Indian lands, an individual tribal member shall be required to obtain a permit under this section.
 - (2) In the case of any permits for the excavation or removal of any archaeological resources located on Indian lands, the permit may be granted only after obtaining the consent of the Indian or Indian tribe owning or having jurisdiction over such lands. The permit shall include such terms and conditions as may be requested

by such Indian or Indian tribe.

- (g)
- (1) No permit or other permission shall be required under the Act of June 8, 1906 (16 U.S.C. 431-433), for any activity for which a permit is issued under this section.
 - (2) Any permit issued under the Act of June 8, 1906, shall remain in effect according to its terms and conditions following the enactment of this Act. No permit shall be required to carry out any activity under a permit issued under the Act of June 8, 1906, before the date of the enactment of this Act which remains in effect as provided in this paragraph, and nothing in this Act shall modify or affect any such permit.
 - (i) Issuance of a permit in accordance with this section and applicable regulations shall not require compliance with section 106 of the Act of October 15, 1966 (80 Stat. 917, 16 U.S.C. 470f).
 - (j) Upon the written request of the Governor of any State, the Federal land manager shall issue a permit, subject to the provisions of subsections (b)(3), (b)(4), (c), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i) of this section for the purpose of conducting archaeological research, excavation, removal, and curation, on behalf of the State or its educational institutions, to such Governor or to such designee as the Governor deems qualified to carry out the intent of this Act.

CUSTODY OF RESOURCES

Sec. 5. The Secretary of the Interior may promulgate regulations providing for-

- (1) the exchange, where appropriate, between suitable universities, museums, or other scientific or educational institutions, of archaeological resources removed from public lands and Indian lands pursuant to this Act, and
- (2) the ultimate disposition of such resources and other resources removed pursuant to the Act of June 27, 1960 (16 U.S.C. 469-469c) or the Act of June 8, 1906 (16 U.S.C. 431-433). Any exchange or ultimate disposition under such regulation of archaeological resources excavated or removed from Indian lands shall be subject to the consent of the Indian or Indian tribe which owns or has jurisdiction over such lands. Following promulgation of regulations, under this section, notwithstanding any other provision of law, such regulations shall govern the disposition of archaeological resources removed from public lands and Indian lands pursuant to this Act.

PROHIBITED ACTS AND CRIMINAL PENALTIES

- Sec. 6.
- (a) No person may excavate, remove, damage, or otherwise alter or deface any archaeological resource located on public lands or Indian lands unless such activity is pursuant to a permit issued under section 4, a permit referred to in section 4(h)(2), or the exemption contained in section 4(g)(1).
 - (b) No person may sell, purchase, exchange, transport, receive, or offer to sell, purchase, or exchange any archaeological resource if such resource was excavated or removed from public lands or Indian lands in violation of-
 - (1) the prohibition contained in subsection (a), or
 - (2) any provision, rule, regulation, ordinance, or permit in effect under any other provision of Federal law.
 - (c) No person may sell, purchase, exchange, transport, receive, or offer to sell, purchase, or exchange, in interstate or foreign commerce, any archaeological resource excavated, removed, sold, purchased, exchanged, transported, or received in violation of any provision, rule, regulation, ordinance, or permit in effect under State or local law.

(d) Any person who knowingly violates, or counsels, procures, solicits, or employs any other person to violate, any prohibition contained in subsection (a), (b), or (c) of this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned not more than one year, or both: Provided, however, That if the commercial or archaeological value of the archaeological resources involved and the cost of restoration and repair of such resources exceeds the sum of \$5,000, such person shall be fined not more than \$20,000 or imprisoned not more than two years, or both. In the case of a second or subsequent such violation upon conviction such person shall be fined not more than \$100,000, or imprisoned not more than five years, or both.

(e) The prohibitions contained in this section shall take effect on the date of the enactment of this Act.

(f) Nothing in subsection (b)(1) of this section shall be deemed applicable to any person with respect to an archaeological resource which was in the lawful possession of such person prior to the date of the enactment of this Act.

(g) Nothing in subsection (d) of this section shall be deemed applicable to any person with respect to the removal of arrowheads located on the surface of the ground.

CIVIL PENALTIES

- Sec. 7. (a) (1) Any person who violates any prohibition contained in an applicable regulation or permit issued under this Act may be assessed a civil penalty by the Federal land manager concerned. No penalty may be assessed under this subsection unless such person is given notice and opportunity for a hearing with respect to such violation. Each violation shall be a separate offense. Any such civil penalty may be remitted or mitigated by the Federal land manager concerned.
- (2) The amount of such penalty shall be determined under regulation promulgated Pursuant to this Act, taking into account, in addition to other factors-
- (A) the archaeological or commercial value of the archaeological resource involved, and
 - (B) the cost of restoration and repair of the resource and the archaeological site involved.

Such regulations shall provide that, in the case of a second or subsequent violation by any person, the amount of such civil penalty may be double the amount which would have been assessed if such violation were the first violation by such person. The amount of any penalty assessed under this subsection for any violation shall not exceed an amount equal to double the cost of restoration and repair of resources and archaeological sites damaged and double the fair market value of resources destroyed or not recovered.

- (3) No penalty shall be assessed under this section for the removal of arrowheads located on the surface of the ground.
- (b) (1) Any person aggrieved by an order assessing a civil penalty under subsection (a) may file a petition for judicial review of such order with the United States District Court for the District of Columbia or for any other district in which such a person resides or transacts business. Such a petition may only be filed within the 30-day period beginning on the date the order making such assessment was issued. The court shall hear such action on the record made before the Federal land manager and shall sustain his action if it is supported by substantial evidence on the record considered as a whole.
- (2) If any person fails to pay an assessment of a civil penalty-
- (A) after the order making the assessment has become a final order and such person has not filed a petition for judicial review of the order in accordance with paragraph (1), or
 - (B) after a court in an action brought under paragraph (1) has entered a final judgment upholding the assessment of a civil penalty, the Federal land managers may request the Attorney General to institute a civil action in a district court of the United States for any district in which such person is found, resides, or transacts business to collect the penalty and such court shall have jurisdiction to hear and decide any such

action. In such action, the validity and amount of such penalty shall not be subject to review.

- (c) Hearings held during proceedings for the assessment of civil penalties authorized by subsection
- (a) shall be conducted in accordance with section 554 of title 5 of the United States Code. The Federal land manager may issue subpoenas for the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production of relevant papers, books, and documents, and administer oaths. Witnesses summoned shall be paid the same fees and mileage that are paid to witnesses in the courts of the United States. In case of contumacy or refusal to obey a subpoena served upon any person pursuant to this paragraph, the district court of the United States for any district in which such person is found or resides or transacts business, upon application by the United States and after notice to such person, shall have jurisdiction to issue an order requiring such person to appear and give testimony before the Federal land manager or to appear and produce documents before the Federal land manager, or both, and any failure to obey such order of the court may be punished by such court as a contempt thereof.

REWARDS; FORFEITURE

- Sec. 8. (a) Upon the certification of the Federal land manager concerned, the Secretary of the Treasury is directed to pay from penalties and fines collected under sections 6 and 7 an amount equal to one-half of such penalty or fine, but not to exceed \$50 0, to any person who furnishes information which leads to the finding of a civil violation, or the conviction of criminal violation, with respect to which such penalty or fine was paid. If several persons provided such information, such amount shall be divided among such persons. No officer or employee of the United States or of any service in the performance of his official duties shall be eligible for payment under this subsection.
- (b) All archaeological resources with respect to which a violation of subsection (a), (b), or (c) of section 6 occurred and which are in the possession of any person, and all vehicles and equipment of any person which were used in connection with such violation, may be (in the discretion of the court or administrative law judge, as the case may be) subject to forfeiture to the United States upon-
- (1) such person's conviction of such violation under section 6,
 - (2) assessment of a civil penalty against such person under section 7 with respect to such violation, or
 - (3) a determination of any court that such archaeological resources, vehicles, or equipment were involved in such violation.
- (c) In cases in which a violation of the prohibition contained in subsection (a), (b), or (c) of section 6 involve archaeological resources excavated or removed from Indian lands, the Federal land manager or the court, as the case may be, shall provide for the payment to the Indian or Indian tribe involved of all penalties collected pursuant to section 7 and for the transfer to such Indian or Indian tribe of all items forfeited under this section.

CONFIDENTIALITY

- Sec. 9. (a) Information concerning the nature and location of any archaeological resource for which the excavation or removal requires a permit or other permission under this Act or under any other provision of Federal law may not be made available to the public under subchapter II of chapter 5 of title 5 of the United States Code or under any other provision of law unless the Federal land manager concerned determines that such disclosure would-
- (1) further the purposes of this Act or the Act of June 27, 1960 (16 U.S.C. 469-469c), and
 - (2) not create a risk of harm to such resources or to the site at which such resources are located.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), upon the written request of the Governor of any State, which request shall state-
- (1) the specific site or area for which information is sought,
 - (2) the purpose for which such information is sought,
 - (3) a commitment by the Governor to adequately protect the confidentiality of such information to protect the resource from commercial exploitation, the Federal land manager concerned shall provide to the Governor information concerning the nature and location of archaeological resources within the State of the requesting Governor.

REGULATIONS; INTERGOVERNMENTAL COORDINATION

- Sec 10. (a) The Secretaries of the Interior, Agriculture and Defense and the Chairman of the Board of the Tennessee Valley Authority, after public notice and hearing, shall promulgate such uniform rules and regulations as may be appropriate to carry out the purposes of this Act. Such rules and regulations may be promulgated only after consideration of the provisions of the American Indian Religious Freedom Act (92 Stat. 469; 42 U.S.C.1996). Each uniform rule or regulation promulgated under this Act shall be submitted on the same calendar day to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the United States Senate and to the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs of the United States House of Representatives, and no such uniform rule or regulation may take effect before the expiration of a period of ninety calendar days following the date of its submission to such Committees.
- (b) Each Federal land manager shall promulgate such rules and regulations under subsection (a), as may be appropriate for the carrying out of his functions and authorities under this Act.

COOPERATION WITH PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS

- Sec. 11. The Secretary of the Interior shall take such action as may be necessary, consistent with the purposes of this Act, to foster and improve the communication, cooperation, and exchange of information between-
- (1) private individuals having collections of archaeological resources and data which were obtained before the date of the enactment of this Act, and
 - (2) Federal authorities responsible for the protection of archaeological resources on the public lands and Indian lands and professional archaeologists and associations of professional archaeologists.

In carrying out this section, the Secretary shall, to the extent practicable and consistent with the provisions of this Act, make efforts to expand the archaeological data base for the archaeological resources of the United States through increased cooperation between private individuals referred to in paragraph (1) and professional archaeologists and archaeological organizations.

SAVINGS PROVISIONS

- Sec. 12.
- (a) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to repeal, modify, or impose additional restrictions on the activities permitted under existing laws and authorities relating to mining, mineral leasing, reclamation, and other multiple uses of the public lands.
 - (b) Nothing in this Act applies to, or requires a permit for, the collection for private purposes of any rock, coin, bullet, or mineral which is not an archaeological resource, as determined under uniform regulations promulgated under section 3(1).
 - (c) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to affect any land other than public land or Indian land or to affect the lawful recovery, collection, or sale of archaeological resources from land other than public land or Indian land.

REPORT

- Sec. 13. As part of the annual report required to be submitted to the specified committees of the Congress pursuant to section 5(c) of the Act of June 27, 1960 (74 Stat. 220; 16 U.S.C. 469-469a), the Secretary of the Interior shall comprehensively report as a separate component on the activities carried out under the provisions of this Act, and he shall make such recommendations as he deems appropriate as to changes or improvements needed in the provisions of this Act. Such report shall include a brief summary of the actions undertaken by the Secretary under section 11 of this Act, relating to cooperation with private individuals.

16 USC (a) Section 3(3) of such Act is amended by striking out the semi-colon
470bb at the end thereof and submitting a period.

16USC (b) Section 6(a) of such Act is amended by inserting after “deface” the
470ee. Following:”, or attempt to excavate, remove, damage, or otherwise alter or deface”.

(c) Section 6(d) of such Act is amended by striking “\$5,000” and inserting in lieu thereof “\$500”.

16 USC (d) Section 10 of such Act is amended by adding the following new
470ii. subsection at the end thereof:

Public (e) Each Federal land manager shall establish a program to increase
lands. public awareness of the significance of the archaeological resources located on public lands and Indian lands and the need to protect such resources. Each such land manager shall submit an annual report to the Committee on Affairs of the United States House of Representatives and to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the United States Senate regarding the actions taken under such program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That the Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979 (Public Law 96-95: 16 U.S.C. 470ii) be amended to add the following new section after section 13:

470mm.

“Sec. 14. The Secretaries of the Interior, Agriculture, and Defense and the Chairman of the Board of the Tennessee Valley Authority shall—

“(a) develop plans for surveying lands under their control to determine the nature and extent of archaeological resources on those lands;

“(b) prepare a schedule for surveying lands that are likely to contain the most scientifically valuable archaeological resources; and

“(c) develop documents for the reporting of suspected violations of this Act and establish when and how those documents are to be completed by officers, employees, and agents of their respective agencies.”.
